Where Is God?

I think all would agree that we are living in times of great wickedness. We see this on a global scale, but also when friends and loved ones are wounded by cruel thoughtless evil people. Many

times when we see evil and wickedness triumphing we are tempted to ask, "Where is God? Why doesn't He do something? How long God, will you let this go on?"

While there are many possible reasons for God's silence, one thing that must be considered would be that God is a God of great mercy. We often quote Isaiah 55:8-9 but forget verse 7.

I am sure you have all read the story of Job in

the Bible. Job struggled with this issue and got so upset that in chapter 24 he could no longer remain silent and began to vent.

Job 24:1 NIRV

24 "Why doesn't the Mighty One set a time for judging sinful people? Why do those who know him have to keep waiting for that day?"

Job wanted God to set up a day of judgment and he wanted it done right now! Obviously, he did not know how great God's mercy was and had never read Isaiah 55 because he lived long before Isaiah. His biggest problem was that he didn't know God and that is why he was so upset. In Job 38 God shows up and for the next four chapters asks Job 81 questions that Job had no answers for, and here is how that all ended. Job says....

Job 42:5-6 Amplified Bible

5 "I had heard of You only by the hearing of the ear, But now my spiritual eye sees You.

6 "Therefore I retract my words and hate myself And I repent in dust and ashes."

It is probably best to let God run the universe and be content to know that He is with us, He sees it all, and He makes no mistakes. There are so many things we can do nothing about, so our focus should be on trusting, and leaving it all in the hands of a righteous God who is perfect in all His ways.

What Does "Ready" Look Like?

Last month I brought you a study of 2 Thessalonians 2:3 which proved that the church will not be here when the antichrist is revealed. Jesus will have already returned and gathered us unto Himself. Oh, what a blessed hope this is!

But, how close are we to this great event? As I look at our world I see a prodigious amount of fear building. The thought that one mad man could plunge this entire planet into a nuclear Armageddon is terrifying and makes me wonder if the time of antichrist may be getting near. Fear is a powerful motivator because people filled with fear will accept anything they think will save them, including a one-world government, led by an evil man who promises to end war and bring peace.

I do not say this to create more fear, (God does not want us living in fear.) but rather to point out that the rapture of the church could be closer than any of us realize, and our number one priority should be to make sure we are ready for His coming. Jesus made it very clear that when He comes not everyone will be taken.

Matthew 24:40-42 ERV

- 40 Two men will be working together in the field. One will be taken and the other will be left.
- 41 Two women will be grinding grain with a mill. One will be taken and the other will be left.
- 42 **So always be ready.** You don't know the day your Lord will come.

When He comes there will be no time to "Get ready." You will either "Be ready" or you will be left behind. I cannot imagine anything more terrifying than knowing the rapture has happened and you have been left behind. Frantically you attempt to call your family, but they are gone. Years ago you prayed a sinners prayer, so why were you left behind, and what does 'ready' look like? In Matthew 24:46 Jesus gives us the answer.

Matthew 24:46 ERV

46 When the master comes and finds that servant doing the work he gave him, it will be a day of blessing for that servant.

There it is, it is short and it is simple. If you want to be sure you are ready, just be sure you are doing what your Lord has told you to do. While this may sound very simple, it exposes a serious issue the church has today. People are encouraged to repeat a prayer, but never told they need to make Jesus the Lord of their life. As a result, the lordship of Jesus lies buried under the rubble of a carnal self-indulgent lifestyle.

Perhaps we need to consider what the Lordship of Jesus looks like. Once again this is very simple. If you have made Jesus the Lord of your life, you will be living in an intimate relationship with Him, and doing what He tells you to do. Have I just described your walk with the Lord? When is the last time God told you to do or say something and you obeyed? Is that even a small part of your life?

I fear that many who call themselves, 'Christian' have never made Jesus the Lord of their life. They may have repeated a prayer and go to church, (Although many don't) but they have no relationship with Jesus, and certainly, He is not their Lord. Based on what Jesus taught, I would have to say that they are in a very dangerous place and run the risk of not being ready for the return of Jesus!

Miss Linda and I start each day by asking the Lord to guide our steps and make us a blessing to those we encounter. The phenomenal things we have experienced could fill a book, and for sure are not coincidental. It happens day after day because each day we make ourselves available to our Lord.

Have you made yourself available to Him? I promise if you do He will speak to you, and I also promise that when He comes, you will be ready and not be left behind!
