Isaiah 41:4 ERV

4 Who was able to make all this happen? Who controlled the lives of everyone from the beginning? I, the Lord, am the one. I was here at the beginning, and I will be here when all things are finished.

In spite of what these verses say, many embrace a belief system that takes away the sovereignty of Almighty God and puts them in charge. As a result, they find themselves asking, "Where is God? Why doesn't He fix this?" Some tell us it is because we lack faith while others come up with a ridiculously simple explanation that only creates more questions. In the book of Isaiah God says something about himself that answers a lot of questions.

Isaiah 45:7 King James Version

7 I form the light, and create darkness: I make peace, and create evil: I the Lord do all these things.

How can He be good if He creates evil? The word "evil" used in this verse means adversity, affliction, calamity, distress, hurt, sorrow, trouble, and ill. Why would a good God create these things?
