

Victory! There is not one person on the planet who doesn't love a victory, and it doesn't matter whether it is a sporting event or an ascent to the summit of a high mountain peak. When we experience victory, the emotion we feel on the inside cannot be contained, and we unashamedly shout for joy. We have just conquered! We have overcome! There is nothing in the world like it.

This year, at the Winter Olympics, both the men's and women's hockey teams won gold medals. The entire nation celebrated, and the men's team was invited to be recognized by President Trump at his State of the Union address. Even some of the Democrats applauded these sports heroes!

But when discussing victory, we should not limit ourselves to sporting events. How about the victory someone experiences when they have been declared cancer-free? I know how that feels because recently I experienced it myself. Last year, I was diagnosed with a very aggressive form of bladder cancer. Subsequently, I received six weeks of treatment, and then on January 23 of this year, I had my bladder scoped and was declared cancer-free. The cancer was completely gone. Victory! I love victory, and for me, that was a victory even greater than winning a gold medal.

In the Bible, we find many illustrations of amazing victories. One of my favorites is the story of David and Goliath. What were the chances of victory? David didn't stand a chance. He was going to die. That is why when Goliath lay dead on the ground, with his head severed from his body, the armies of Israel erupted with shouts of joy. What a great moment that must have been! But that is not the greatest victory found in the Bible.

Without doubt, there is one that stands far above any other, and that is the moment Jesus came out of the tomb, victorious over death, hell, and the grave. All power and authority had been given to him. You talk about snatching victory out of

the jaws of defeat; this was the ultimate example of that. A man hanging lifeless on a cross is the ultimate picture of defeat. But he was only defeated until he wasn't, and he wasn't when he came out of the tomb, victorious!

But now we must talk about a huge problem. The problem is that we all want victory, but we don't want any battles. As much as we love victories, we hate battles even more! If we had our way, we would never have to fight a battle. There would be no mountains to climb, no giants to kill, no crosses to carry, and no cancers to overcome. The only hockey we might play would be practice scrimmages against an invisible opponent. There would also be one other thing missing in our lives; there would be no victories because, before you can have a victory, you must have a battle. Please, let that truth sink deep into your soul.

Miss Linda and I know of so many who faced situations last year that turned their lives into battlefields. They were in our prayers because we knew that what they were facing could crush them. Some faced life-threatening health issues, some had to deal with the death of a loved one, and some had seen a son or daughter abandon their faith. But I want to remind those who are fatigued and wondering how long they can keep going: if we never have battles, we can never have victories.

Right now, you may feel like you're climbing a high mountain peak and are so fatigued that you don't feel like you can go on. Your mind is telling you to give up, but God is saying, "In your weakness, my strength is made perfect. Press on, my beloved, your victory will come, and the greater the battle has been, the greater the victory will be."
